LAST CALL for a Smith River Map


The Smith River is not just a river — it's a lifeline for wildlife, fishing, and recreation that generates \$11 million annually for the local economy. **FROM NOW UNTIL AUGUST 31,** fill out <u>THIS FORM</u> to help #SaveOurSmith and **receive a free custom postcard-sized map of the Smith River!**

Why now? An Australian mining company called Sandfire Resources wants to develop a large underground copper mine near the headwaters of Sheep Creek — an essential tributary to the Smith River. The project, known as the Black Butte Copper Mine, threatens to release acid mine drainage and wastewater containing arsenic and other toxins into the river, thereby posing a serious threat to the local fisheries, ranches, and recreational opportunities that are dependent on good water quality.

Ask the Forest Service to Protect the Smith River

Sandfire's current proposal is to operate on private land, however, the mining company has already leased and is looking to expand into parcels of nearby Forest Service land. While only the courts can decide the outcome of what happens on private land, the Forest Service has the power to protect the Smith and our nearby public lands by blocking Sandfire's expansion with an administrative mineral withdrawal.

Tell Rep. Zinke to Protect our Public Lands

U.S. Representative Ryan Zinke has co-sponsored a bill aimed at overturning the Bureau of Land Management (BLM)'s recently finalized "Public Lands Rule." The rule is one of several recently finalized by the BLM that improves public lands management. Specifically, this rule clarifies that managing BLM land for conservation fits squarely within the agency's legal mandate, and that **conservation sits on equal footing to other uses** such as extraction and other commodity-driven development. It was also supported by <u>92% of the 150,000</u> comments made during the 90-day public comment period.

Send a message to Rep. Zinke

Considering that <u>95% of Montanans</u> visited national public lands in 2023 and <u>78% of</u> <u>Montanans</u> think that more emphasis should be placed on conservation-related land uses, the Public Lands Rule is a major win. Montanans love public lands, and conserving them is crucial to our way of life in the Treasure State. By supporting the charge against the Public Lands Rule, Rep. Zinke is ignoring the broad majority of Montanans.
