

Happy April, Montana Conservation Voters!

While the weather is caught between winter and spring, the end of the 69th Legislature is fast approaching. May 3 is the scheduled final day.

A lot has happened over the past month, and even in just the last week. Notable victories include the defeat of House Joint 24 and Senate Bill 42. HJ 24 supported Utah's lawsuit to seize control of over 18 million acres of federal public land, and SB 42 sought to force Montana's District Court judges and Supreme Court justices to declare a political party affiliation when running for election.

These are significant wins in defense of our lands and democracy — and they're YOUR wins. Thousands of you have signed petitions, made phone calls, and even written on wood cookies to urge lawmakers to stand up for Montana, its Constitution, and its public lands.

But now, it's crunch time. The next few weeks will be critical as bills either die or become law — and the stakes are HIGH. We need to stay vigilant, continuing to oppose harmful bills and support the good ones. From public land funding to protecting our rights as citizens, there's still much to fight for.

After the legislative session wraps, MCV will release our annual scorecard to hold our elected officials accountable. We'll celebrate the good and call out the bad. Let's hope we enter May with more of the former. Now more than ever, it's vital for conservationists across the state to support and elect local officials who will protect our Montana way of life and public lands.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

We are less than a month from the end of the 69th Montana Legislature, and things are moving quickly.

Saturday, April 5, marked the deadline for transmittal of revenue bills, referenda proposals, and general joint resolutions. On Tuesday, April 8, all appropriations bills had to be transmitted to the next chamber.

Last week, we saw major victories for Montana's public lands and democracy:

- HJ 24 The resolution in support of Utah's lawsuit to seize **control of over 18.5 million** acres of federal public land was defeated in the House. This bill posed a dangerous threat to public lands in Montana, and thanks to YOU, it was stopped cold with a 66-34 vote.
- SB 307 The bill, which sought to strip more than \$20 million from our public lands over the next two years and eliminate an additional \$12.6 million for state parks, trails stewardship, and wildlife conservation programs, was stopped in the Senate.
- SJ 14 The resolution urging Congress to remove protections from all Wilderness Study Areas and inventoried roadless areas in Montana did not make it out of committee.
- SB 42 This bill, which would have required Montana Supreme Court justices and District Court judges to identify with a political party when running for election, failed on the House Floor.

THANK YOU for making these victories possible! Through your petitions, emails, and phone calls to key legislators, Team MCV has been able to make a real impact on important legislation. But the fight isn't over — there is still much more to do.

FIELD NOTES


